Once again GMS had great results on the state CST test. We increased our API score by an outstanding 41 points. That is an increase of 83 points over two years. This is higher than any other middle school in the Whittier and Santa Fe Springs area. Our Algebra proficient and advanced rate jumped up to 92%, also higher than all of the middle schools in the Whittier and Santa Fe Springs area. We also improved on the 7th grade state writing test, as 93% of our students got a six or an eight,



Our API increased by 41 points and our Academy kids got great results on their state tests. On a different note, we have started a partnership with Cal State Long Beach to provide a Math, Engineering, Science, Achievement (MESA) club for our STEM students and any other student interested in participating in STEM-related competitions. Our STEM students will also participate in a program with USC called Botball where our kids program robots to complete certain functions during a competition against other middle and high school students.
