Principal's Corner

I want to take the time to welcome you to a new school year at GMS. With the early start this year we are well into the 2013-2014 school year. One of the biggest changes we have made for this school year is to transition from the quarter grading system to the trimester grading system.

We did this for several reasons, but two of the main reasons are that students have more time (three more weeks) to complete their work and now all students in the South Whittier School District are on the same calendar. The trimester goes slower, so kids have more time to get caught up if they get behind. And with all South Whittier schools on the trimester system report cards will come out at the same time and parent conferences will be the same week. We think the trimester system is better for kids and families. As I have said before. "Come see the difference at Graves Middle School!"





Promotion Policy continued

Here are the requirements our students have to meet as part of GMS' 8th Grade Promotion Policy:

- 1) 2.0 cumulative GPA for each trimester
- 2) No "D's" or "F's" for each trimester
- 3) No more than 10% absences for the year
- 4) No serious or persistent disciplinary problems (including low citizenship marks)

We want to make sure that we are communicating our expectations to you early in the school year and let you know that we will communicate with you frequently about your child's progress. We also want you to know that our Aeries Parent Portal system allows you to see your child's grades, attendance, and assignments from any web-enabled device at any time, in real time. In addition, every three weeks we have academic advisory, so your child will be bringing home her advisory card with her current GPA and possibly a remediation plan if she is at-risk of not meeting our rigorous requirements. As you can see, we have made a big commitment to your child's academic success at GMS. We look forward to working with you and your child to give him every opportunity to succeed this year.

GMS Expands Its Technology for '13-'14

GMS currently has a new computer lab, 40 Apple iPads, and we are also adding two new computer labs, one in the library and one in a classroom. We are also offering a technology class to our 7th graders so they can use technology effectively to learn the course content in all of their classes. In addition, our kids are learning Prezi, PowerPoint, typing, word processing, email, and internet research to prepare for college and careers. They will also be writing their essays on the computer and they will eventually take their standardized tests on the computer too.

We feel that the use of this technology will help students not only learn to use educational technology more effectively, but it will also allow students to be prepared for the upcoming Common Core State Standards (CCSS), which will replace the California State Standards. We also want to prepare them for the upcoming new state assessment, the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC), which will replace the California Standards Test (CST). We are facing a lot of exciting change in education and we know this will make a difference for our kids as they progress through their time at GMS and then head to high school and college or a career. Our kids will be ready for anything!
