You will read about our state and nationally recognized programs, our Chromebook program, and our school sports program. But we also want to share some of the other important programs at GMS too.

We are very excited to have Mr. Dan Honeycutt serve as our GMS coach, as he will continue to support our at-risk students as well as help with technology and he will support our teachers as they learn new and successful ways to help our kids with the Common Core Standards. We also implemented a program that is similar to WUHSD, which we call Mind the Red-Binder Check Mondays. This program will help our kids get support with their grades and missing assignments. Graves was also invited to attend a summer training session for our AVID program, which puts us on track to become an AVID National Demonstration Site. This also means that we will be in the top 4% of all middle school AVID programs throughout the entire nation. Once again, we want to work hard, stay humble, and always improve so we can receive National Demonstration status and so we can continue to support our kids.

We are also proud to share that half of the student ambassadors at the AVID Summer Institute in Anaheim were from Graves. Students were selected from the entire L.A. and Orange County area and our kids did an awesome job representing GMS and the AVID program. We are also proud of our AVID Excel program (for our English learners) for their great progress this year. We look forward to the rest of the school year and we will keep you abreast of our progress.

GMS Rolls Out Chromebooks in the AVID Program

We are excited to share information about the roll out of Chromebooks in our AVID program. As part of a four-year plan we are piloting a Chromebook 1-1 program with our 7th grade traditional AVID students and our 7th grade AVID Excel students.

Graves is on the cutting edge with our 1-1 Chromebook program, as our students are allowed to take the Chromebooks home on a daily basis and they can keep them for the two years they are at GMS as long as they take care of them. This puts our kids in a position to enjoy 21st Century educational tools every single day. Students are learning to use Google Classroom, Google Apps for Education (GAFE), and they are making presentations on their Chromebooks. Google Classroom is like an online classroom where kids can talk to their teachers and their classmates after school hours. They can download their assignments and they can also complete them online and turn them in online rather than having to print them out. GAFE are the different apps in the "Google world" that can be used to write papers, make presentations, meet online, and do many other things online. This gives us the opportunity to become a paperless school in the near future. Our online textbooks, online math programs, GAFE, and Google Classroom put us well on the road to our goal.
