STAR Testing continued

As you know, Graves had great test results last year and we improved by 42 points, which was the highest Academic Performance Index (API) improvement of all of the middle schools in the Whittier and Santa Fe Springs area. We have been giving our Action Learning Systems benchmark assessments and we are encouraged by the results we have seen so far. The benchmark results lead us to believe that our students are on target to reach "Safe Harbor" and to have another good year on our API.

We will need your help though. We ask that you encourage your son or daughter to attend school every day and be on time, do their best on the test, and set high goals for himself or
