CST Results are Stellar at Graves

GMS increased its API score by an outstanding 42 points. This is higher than any other middle school in the Whittier and Santa Fe Springs area. Our Algebra proficient and advanced rate was 77%, higher than all of the middle schools in the Whittier and Santa Fe Springs area. In addition, 89% of our students got a 6 or an 8 (equivalent to proficient or advanced) on the 7th grade CST writing test. Additionally, 72% of our 8th grade Language Arts academy students and 70% of our 7th grade Pre-Algebra Academy students received a proficient or advanced on the CST test. The Graves staff is proud of our students for doing such an outstanding job on the CST test.

New Discipline Policy Goes into Effect at GMS

Graves had our discipline assembly on Friday, September 2nd to ensure that all students are aware of the new rules and regulations at the school. Students sat attentively as they listened to the new rules at Graves. Classroom and school wide behavior management begins with progressive discipline measures that ensure that students are treated fairly, but also firmly and consistently when they make bad decisions. Some of the new rules included having to have their ID on them at all times in order to leave the classroom for any reason. Students who are caught breaking classroom or school rules will face consequences that include detention, school beautification, suspension, expulsion, and possibly be subject to the Juvenile Citation Program, (Penal Code 415), which could include a ticket up to \$400. Also a court date, and possible arrest if they tag/destroy school property or fight on or off campus. Making GMS a safe and orderly school is our highest priority.
