### Last Day of School



### Principal's Corner

I don't know where the time went: I say this as we wind down the 2012-13 school year. This year went by very quickly, and it was a great year for Graves. One of the things we are most excited about is the 21 point increase we received on our API. The API is the tool the state of California uses to inform parents and students about our public schools. After adding the 21 point increase a few weeks ago, GMS' improvement was 62 points last year and by 104 points over the last two years. Just as a point of reference, this is the highest in the Whittier and Santa Fe Springs area and one of the highest in the entire L.A. area. This type of growth in virtually unheard of, so we are very happy. We are also proud of our 8 similar schools ranking. What this means is that when compared to schools that are similar to ours, we have an 8 out of 10 ranking (we are better than 80% of all schools like our own). Although we are happy about this success, we want to stay humble, hungry, and work hard to improve even more!

### Common Core State Standards (CCSS)
