SBAC Assessment 2015

As I mentioned previously, GMS is in the process of completing the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC) test of the Common Core State Standards (CCSS). This was the second year the SBAC was given, but it is the first year that the full assessment was given (a full set of questions in language arts and math and two performance tasks). Last year we gave half the questions in language arts, half in math, and did one performance task. The performance task is based on students doing group work, doing some research, and then answering some tough questions. It is a very rigorous test.

The state of California wants schools to communicate two important things about this year's test. The first thing is that you can't compare the new SBAC state test to the old CST state test because they are very different tests (computer based with a lot of writing v. paper and pencil with multiple choice only). It would be like comparing a sports car (SBAC) to a horse (CST) because they are both forms of transportation, it just wouldn't make sense. The other thing we need to communicate is that because the SBAC is a much harder test, the state thinks that the number of kids who have a rating of "standard met" will start out pretty low, regardless of what school students attend. This happened with the old CST too. We know that this a better test, so we will strive to improve every year.

Our spring sports program concluded with our 8th grade boys' soccer team having had a lot of success and our 7th grade boys' soccer team dominating the league. Our 8th grade boys' soccer team had some great games this year. During the season they played very well and really took it to some of their opponents. They finished toward the top of the league.
